MAINTAIN PROPER STORAGE CONDITIONS

Keep bins clean, sealed, and well-aerated to prevent mold and pests.

IMPLEMENT A MONITORING ROUTINE

Regularly check grain for signs of spoilage, such as odors or hot spots.

5

PLAN PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE

Service and calibrate equipment prior to harvest to ensure efficient operation.



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
